HOW TO FEST

Express Online Press Credential

EMBARGO TIMING

[While online access begins after the embargos have lifted, we are sharing the general embargo rules and details here for your awareness.] **Reviews for world premiere films are embargoed until the end of the first public-ticketed premiere screening of the film, unless otherwise noted.**

Some films making their world premiere have a Press and Industry (P&I) screening in advance of the film's first public screening, so please be certain to check before posting. This embargo timing includes social media reviews.

If working with an assignment editor who will be posting your reviews, please make sure to provide them with the embargo schedule.

ONLINE VIEWING LOGISTICS

Your Express Online Press Credential grants access to the professional P&I screening platform “My Viewing Room”, which is separate from the online experience for public viewers and general online press pass holders. To take advantage of these exclusive benefits you must be logged in with your Festival credentials and have confirmed your active Express Online Press Credential.

- No reservations are required
- No screening capacities
- Your pass allows for one view per feature film or Episodic piece
- You can only be logged into your account on one device at a time
- Online viewing is not geo-blocked for online Press & Industry screenings
- No access to public online screenings

FILMS AVAILABLE ONLINE

Feature films in competition sections (U.S. Dramatic, U.S. Documentary, World Cinema Dramatic, World Cinema Documentary, NEXT) will be available online for accredited press viewers. Short films, Episodic selections, and additional feature films may opt-in for online screenings.

Once the window for online access begins, on Wednesday, January 28 at 8:00 a.m. MT, the “My Viewing Room” area of the Festival site will be populated with the films in the online program.

Beyond Film events will take place in person from January 23–31, 2026, with most of the Beyond Film offerings available to audiences online the day following the in-person event on festival.sundance.org throughout the Festival.

ONLINE VIEWING FROM ANYWHERE, ON YOUR PREFERRED DEVICE

Accredited express press members have multiple ways to view Festival films. Films can be accessed via a browser, or on your TV through the Online Festival Screenings App. Extensive information about online viewing technical requirements and tips can be found in the [How to Fest - Watch Online](#) section of festival.sundance.org.

To reflect where you’ll be watching, online screenings will be displayed on festival.sundance.org in your current local time zone. (Please note, any additional tickets you purchase for online screenings will be bound by public ticket rules, including geoblocking to the U.S.)

TIMING & VIEWING DURATION

VOD viewing via the “My Viewing Room” area of the Festival site, January 28–February 1. Viewing begins at 8:00 a.m. MT on Wednesday, January 28 through 11:55 p.m. MT on Sunday,

February 1. [On Sunday, February 1, you can view the film as long as you start by 11:55 p.m. MT]

- Feature films permit one view per film. Once you hit play you have 8 hours to view the film, after which it expires.
- Episodic works permit one view per project. Once you hit play you have 12 hrs to view the project, after which it expires.
- Short films have no viewing limitations within the online Festival dates and times.

REMINDER: From the moment you begin watching a feature film or episodic selection you have a set amount of time to complete that screening. Within that window, you can pause, skip backward or ahead, or click away and come back, but that film will no longer be available after the time has elapsed.

FILM TEAM Q&As

Q&As will be included on feature films in competition sections and other features that opt in for public online viewing. Short Film Programs, Episodic selections, and feature films available only to Press and Industry viewers will not include Q&As. If you miss a Q&A or wish to learn about a film team whose work is not screening online, look for their Meet the Artist videos on festival.sundance.org. *(Please note, films premiering in person on Tuesday may not have the Q&As available for the online screening beginning on Wednesday. Those will be available later in the week.)*

HOW TO UNLOCK AN ONLINE P&I SCREENING

IN “My Viewing Room”

- First, go to “My Viewing Room” to see the list of available films. If “My Viewing Room” is not displayed under your account profile please make sure you are signed into your account associated with your Press Credential. (“My Viewing Room” may appear before the online window of the Festival starts, but the films will not be active to view until the online window has begun on Wednesday, January 28 at 8:00 a.m. MT.)
- Select the film you wish to view and click “Unlock Now.”
- The “Watch Now” option will now be available. Clicking “Watch Now” will bring up the 8-hour viewing window prompt (12 hours for episodic): if you are ready to start your screening click “Yes” to continue to the film. Click “Not Yet” to return to it later.

PRESS RESOURCES

Resources available to accredited press include:

- **HOW TO FEST GUIDES:** You can reference each How To Fest guide, organized by pass type, when you are logged into your Festival account under How To Fest > Press.
- **P&I SCREENING SCHEDULE:** The [Screening Schedule for Industry and Press](#) displays in-person public screenings, P&I screenings, and online screenings in a downloadable, sortable view. Download a copy or use a temporary filter view to sort based on your own criteria.
 - Note that all screening times are displayed in **Mountain Time**.

- As in past years, there are likely to be additions to the program announced closer to the Festival dates. Additions will be highlighted on this schedule as they become available.
- **PR CONTACT LIST:** The [PR Contact List](#) displays contact information for PR reps for films that have been hired directly to oversee their films at the Festival. (Please note, this contact list is also available when you are logged into your Festival account under How To Fest > Press.)
- **FILM STILLs:** The [Festival Dropbox](#) has images for all films, which accredited press may use in coverage. During the Festival, we also make images of Festival activities available in the [Festival Flickr Album](#).
- **INTERVIEW REQUEST FORM:** You can email us at press@sundance.org for interview requests or make a request via the [link in the press center](#). We are here to help you navigate the platform and to support your coverage as you plan, watch, and write.

As the Festival approaches, we will be adding stat sheets, overview materials, a link to access video clips and more!
